

KINDERGARTEN AT-A-GLANCE

CREATIVE EXPRESSION

Explore self-expression through creative thought, language, movement, music and drama.

Become aware of various forms of expression

Comprehend and respond to various kinds of texts

- connect oral language with print and pictures
- identify rhyming words in oral language
- draw records or tell about ideas and experiences.

Communicate clearly

- form some recognizable letters
- connect letters with sounds in words
- follow one- or two-step instructions.

Manage ideas and information

- ask questions to satisfy curiosity and make sense of information
- share new learnings with others.

Respect and support others

- participate in class and group activities
- find ways to be helpful to others.

Explore thoughts, ideas, feelings and experiences

- talk about favourite books, songs, poems, pictures
- listen to others
- connect related ideas and information.

Develop basic locomotor, nonlocomotor and fine motor skills.

Welcome to Kindergarten

Entering Kindergarten is an exciting time for children. Parents and teachers work together to make the transition from home to school as smooth as possible.

Learning in Kindergarten

The curriculum, or *Kindergarten Program Statement*, is developed by Alberta Education in consultation with early childhood educators. It describes what young children need to learn to prepare for entry into Grade 1, and provides a foundation for later grades. Children accomplish these learnings not only in the Kindergarten program, but also in their homes and communities.

Teachers use the curriculum to plan learning activities that meet the Kindergarten children's needs and abilities, and to assess their progress. The Kindergarten area is a busy and ever-changing place, with a variety of learning centres.

Children with an assessed disability/delay may receive educational programming prior to the Kindergarten year.

How Can I Help My Child?

- Be involved in the Kindergarten experience as much as you can.

- Encourage your child through at-home activities, such as bedtime reading, listening to music, making decisions by offering choices, practising motor skills such as throwing and catching, drawing, cutting and doing puzzles.
